# Happy Camp

Camping is one of the absolute best ways to escape your daily routine and enjoy nature. That's why over 40 million people go camping each year! We're fortunate enough to have our very own campground, Happy Camp, in Canyon Lake. With stunning lake views and beach-front campsites, Happy Camp is one of our favorite spots in the community. Happy Camp is designed to provide guests with a truly unique camping experience. The campground boasts over 50 RV and tent sites and a long list of amenities and services that will make your next camping adventure a blast! Make your next camping adventure even better with these helpful tips.



### BOOK YOUR STAY AT HAPPY CAMP

### WHAT TO EXPECT AT HAPPY CAMP

Happy Camp is ideal for all levels of campers, offering both RV and tent sites. With amenities like recently renovated restrooms with showers, a dump station, picnic areas, a new playground, cornhole, horseshoes, ice, propane, and even Wi-Fi access, it has everything you need for a comfortable camping adventure.



## WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT DUMPING

After hooking up your RV, be sure not to leave the black tank "open"; dump it when the black tank is 2/3 or more full. Otherwise, you stand a good chance of having a clog. The same is true with the gray tank. Dump black first every time, so the gray water can help clean out the dump hose. The dump station at Happy Camp is also available for \$15 per dump for Canyon Lake POA members who need to dump their RVs.

## BE A GOOD CAMPING NEIGHBOR

A campground is like a temporary community, so you should make an effort to be courteous to your neighbors. You can do this by respecting your campsite boundaries, minding your garbage, keeping pets leashed, ensuring your hookups are not leaking, and following the quiet hours rule (from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m., no amplified speakers, loud radios, televisions, generator, or other loud disturbances). Also, be advised that dumpsters are for campers' camping trash only.

## HELP KEEP CHILDREN SAFE

Happy Camp is a safe, family-friendly campground. However, vehicles do regularly drive through the campground. While driving through the campground, please drive slowly and be alert for guests. Also, to help keep children safe, there is a rule that children eight and younger must be under the direct supervision of a responsible adult at all times. The curfew for minors (under 18) is 10 p.m.



## RV CAMPING

Most campers at Happy Camp use an RV. The RV needs to be level when parking and setting up. An unstable RV can be uncomfortable and cause issues within the RV, like jeopardizing the fridge function. Most RVs have some sort of leveling system, and there are handy tools like leveling blocks to help you level your RV. Also, consider using wheel chocks to keep your RV from rolling while parked. After you level your RV, be sure to chock it.



## PLAN FOR FUN

There is no shortage of fun at Happy Camp, with several family amenities already available. But it is best to have a game plan of what everyone enjoys so that everyone has the opportunity to do something they want. Some ideas of fun family activities to consider while staying at Happy Camp include playing on the new playground, playing cornhole or horseshoes, fishing, swimming, kayaking, paddleboarding, enjoying your boat on the lake, or just relaxing and enjoying the scenery.



## FIRE PITS & GRILLS

Campers are welcome to bring their own portable fire pit or grill. Fire pits must have legs and must be covered. Fire pits may not be permitted if Riverside County has a "No Burn Order" in effect. If you have a propane grill or fire pit, you can refill your propane tanks at Happy Camp from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.



## BOATING

Many campers bring their boats to enjoy the lake on their camping adventure (the boat must be registered with the Canyon Lake POA). Campers are welcome to tie their boats on either of the side docks, but not the center dock, which is the gas dock. Speaking of the gas dock, boats can fill up daily

## Sunset Beach

Situated adjacent to the Lodge, Sunset Beach is the largest beach in Canyon Lake, stretching over 500 feet. This vibrant beach features a spacious roped swimming area, a playground, volleyball net, and shaded seating areas. The nearby Canyon Lake Lodge offers dining options to enjoy after a fun day at the beach, while the tennis courts provide a chance to play before or after your visit. Overlooking the main lake and the bustling boating area, Sunset Beach provides a lively backdrop with high-flying wakeboarders and cruising boats.

## HOURS

Canyon Lake's parks and beaches play a very important part in the overall quality of life for Canyon Lake residents and visitors. All parks and beaches are open daily from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. in the spring and summer (May 1 – Sept. 30) and 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. (Oct. 1 – Apr. 30).



## RESTRICTED SWIM AREAS

There are no lifeguards or attendants on duty at any beach. Swimming and water activities are at your own risk. Please note the following areas are restricted for swimming:

- No swimming allowed in tunnels.
- Swimming, snorkeling, diving, and use of small flotation devices should not go beyond 50 feet from the shore and are prohibited on the Main Lake Ski Area.



## NO OPEN FIRES

Please remember that no open fires or beach fires are permitted on the beaches. Charcoal fires are permitted in designated barbecues.

## POOL RULE REMINDERS

### SUPERVISION

Children 14 and younger must be accompanied by an adult, and those five and younger must have direct adult supervision. While pool attendants are present, no lifeguard is on duty, so it is crucial to supervise inexperienced swimmers.

### ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT RULES

- Babies, toddlers, and incontinent adults must wear waterproof swim pants or briefs.
- Alcohol and glass objects are strictly forbidden. Coolers will be inspected to ensure compliance.

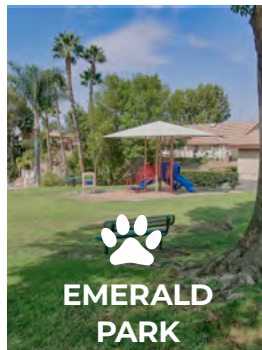

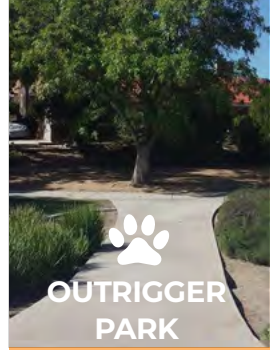
### HARRELSON PARK

# WHEN TO CALL COMMUNITY PATROL & MARINE PATROL

Community Patrol: 951.246.2721 | Marine Patrol: 951.246.3473



**IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY, PHYSICAL ALTERCATION, THEFT, TRAFFIC ACCIDENT, LIFE-THREATENING EMERGENCY, AND/OR ANY OTHER CRIMINAL ACTIVITY, CALL 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY.**

The primary function of Community & Marine Patrol is to provide the community with services that include access control at the entry gates, Rules & Regulations compliance, and incident observation and reporting to the Canyon Lake POA. Their services do not replace outside public safety agencies such as law enforcement, fire services, medical services, city code enforcement, etc.

The following are examples of incidents in which you should call Community Patrol:

- Barking Dogs & Dogs Off-Leash [ GR.2.14 ]
- Curfew [ GR.2.11 ]
- Door-to-Door Solicitation [ GR.2.16 ]
- Loitering [ GR.2.12 ]

- Prohibited Vehicles Driving in Community (i.e. motorcycles, off-road vehicles, etc.) [ GR.5.2 ]
- Speeding & Stop Sign Violations [ GR.5.1c & GR.5.1o ]
- Unlicensed Fishing [ GR.4.4 ]
- Vandalism/Damage to Common Area [ GR.2.9 & GR.2.10 ]

- Boat Distress Assistance Needed
- Excessive Wake [ LM.9.20 ]
- Quagga Mussel Inspections [ LM.10.4 ]
- Safety Inspections [ LM.2.10 ]
- Speeding Violations [ LM.6.7 ]

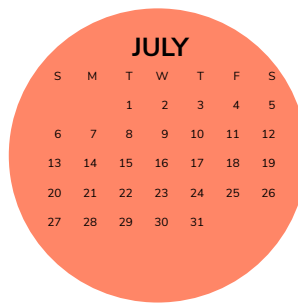

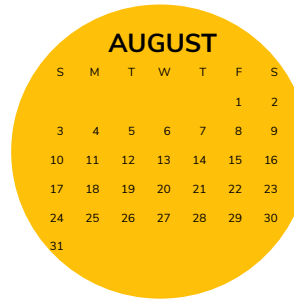
