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# A LETTER FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

As we close out 2025, I want to take a moment to reflect on what has been an exciting and productive season here in Canyon Lake. From new facility improvements to major community events and another strong phase of road work, there has been no shortage of momentum. The past few months have been a testament to what we can accomplish together.

We are now in the third year of our multi-year pavement improvement program, and construction is well underway. This fall and winter, we are tackling five phases of road reconstruction, covering several key streets throughout the community. This work builds on the solid foundation we established in the first two years, and we will continue updating our pavement management plan and asphalt index to guide the next phases. Maintaining our roads is one of the biggest responsibilities we have, and our investment today helps reduce costs and liabilities in the future. You can find a full breakdown of the work schedule on page 14.

This issue also highlights the recent upgrades to the motorcycle parking area at the Senior Center. As part of our long-range planning efforts, we seal coated and restriped the lot, installed new security fencing and cameras, and added additional spaces. These enhancements not only improve the look and function of the area, but also provide a safer and more reliable parking option for members who own motorcycles and depend on these designated spaces, since motorcycles are not permitted to be stored or operated inside the community.

Looking ahead, this issue is full of festive opportunities to get involved and enjoy the season. From the Tree Lighting Festival to the Parade of Lights, there's something for everyone. Whether you are touring beautifully decorated homes or enjoying Brunch with Santa, the months ahead are packed with ways to celebrate. You can find the full lineup of events starting on page 20.

## What is the Recreation Committee?

The Recreation Committee plays an essential role in supporting the amenities, programs, and spaces that make Canyon Lake one of the most active and family-friendly communities in Southern California. This advisory committee works closely with Canyon Lake POA staff to evaluate recreation programs, review facility needs, and recommend improvements that enhance the member experience.

Every other month, the committee meets to discuss everything from park maintenance and facility usage to new program ideas and policy updates. Their feedback helps guide the decisions that ensure our recreational spaces and activities remain enjoyable, accessible, and well-managed for everyone.

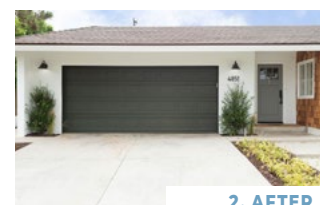
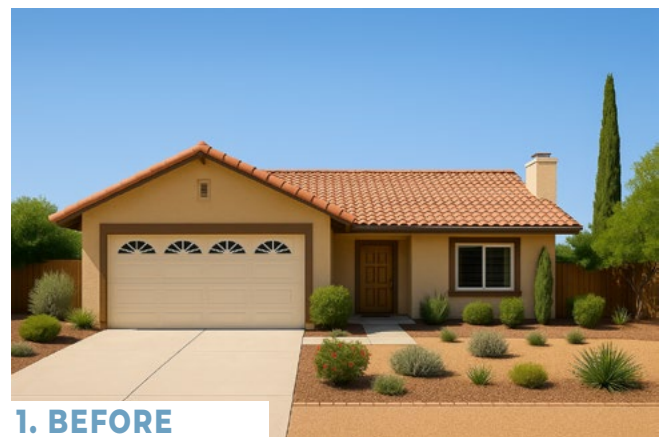
# The Everyday Makeover: FOR A BETTER HOME

## Small Changes, Big Difference

*Easy ways to enhance your home and neighborhood for less.*

### EASY VISUAL FIXES

- 1 Modernize Your Garage Door**  
Those plastic sunburst inserts? Pop them out for an instant upgrade. It's a free, simple way to refresh your home's curb appeal. Try one window first. If you like the cleaner look, finish the rest and give the door a quick wash for a freshly updated appearance.
- 2 Paint, Patch, and Polish**  
A fresh coat of paint on trim or shutters can make a big impact. Choose neutral tones that complement nearby homes and comply with Canyon Lake POA's architectural rules and guidelines. Replace rusted fixtures, clean address numbers, and refresh doormats for a well-kept look.
- 3 Upgrade Porch Lighting**  
Replace outdated fixtures or spray-paint them matte black, bronze, or brushed nickel. Use bulbs in the 2700–3000K range for a welcoming, golden glow at night.
- 4 Paint or Stain the Front Door**  
A new coat of paint refreshes your entry and boosts curb appeal. Choose a color that fits the Canyon Lake POA architectural rules and guidelines. Note that an over-the-counter application is available for this improvement.
- Tidy Driveway and Walkway Edges**  
Trimming grass and weeds along driveways and sidewalks instantly improves curb appeal, costs nothing, and supports community architectural standards for a clean, consistent look.



# Budget-Friendly Ideas & NEIGHBORHOOD

## Light That Flatters, Not Flares

Outdoor lighting does more than brighten a walkway — it sets the tone for your home after dark. The right light feels calm and welcoming, while the wrong one can look cold or harsh. When replacing bulbs, pay attention to one small detail: the Kelvin number on the box. This rating determines whether the light gives off a soft golden glow or a bluish-white glare.

### Why It Matters

Softer and warmer tones highlight textures like wood, stone, and landscaping in a flattering way. Harsher, blue-toned lighting can wash out color and create sharp contrast that feels out of place in residential areas. Just as interior lighting makes a room comfortable, exterior lighting can make your home feel serene and inviting or stark and unwelcoming.

### Common Mistakes

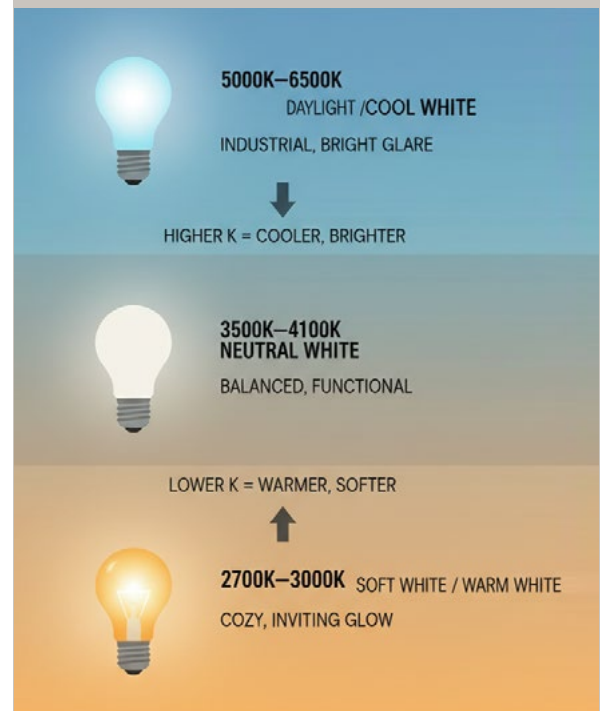
- **Mixing colors:** One bright white bulb next to a soft gold one looks uneven. Keep the same color temperature across fixtures.
- **Choosing by watts:** Brightness is measured in lumens, not watts or Kelvins. A lower-watt LED with a lower Kelvin rating can still provide plenty of light without glare.
- **Over-lighting:** Fewer, well-placed fixtures with the right tone look better than flooding an area with harsh light.

### The Community Glow

When homes use similar, natural-looking light, the neighborhood feels unified and warm. Harsh, mismatched lighting stands out for the wrong reasons, while softer tones create a cohesive evening glow that enhances the landscape rather than competing with it.

## WHAT ARE KELVINS?

Kelvins measure the color temperature of light — not how hot the bulb gets, but how warm or cool the light *looks*.



## NEIGHBORHOOD GLOW TEST

When you are out at night, notice which homes look truly warm and welcoming. Chances are, they're using lower Kelvin lights for the perfect ambiance.





# EVERYDAY ACTIONS

## to Help Keep Canyon Lake Clean & Healthy

Canyon Lake is more than just a place to boat, fish, or swim — it's also part of a larger watershed where everything we do on land eventually affects the water. While regional agencies play a major role in managing the lake, individual households also hold the power to protect its health. The truth is, many of the nutrients and pollutants that fuel harmful algal blooms or cloud the water can be limited or prevented by simple everyday actions around our homes.

### 1 USE FEWER CHEMICALS

#### The Issue:

- Overuse of fertilizers and pesticides contributes significantly to lake pollution.
- Rain or irrigation washes these chemicals into storm drains and the lake.
- Fertilizers release nitrogen and phosphorus that feed algae growth.
- Pesticides can harm aquatic insects and fish.

#### What Can You Do?

- Use natural soil amendments instead of chemical fertilizers.
- Choose native plants that require little to no fertilizer.
- Apply treatments sparingly and avoid using them near the shoreline.

### 2 CLEAN UP WASTE

#### The Issue:

- Pet waste contains bacteria, nitrogen, and phosphorus that harm water quality.
- When left on the ground, rain washes it into storm drains or directly into the lake.
- Street litter like plastic bottles, cigarette butts, and food wrappers also end up in the lake through storm drains.

#### What Can You Do?

- Always pick up after your pets and dispose of waste properly.
- Pick up litter when you see it to prevent it from washing into drains.
- Encourage neighbors to keep streets and yards clean to protect the lake.

### 3 KEEP DRAINS CLEAR

#### The Issue:

- Storm drains do not connect to a treatment plant — they flow directly into the lake.
- Dumping leaves, grass clippings, oil, or paint sends pollutants straight into the water.
- Blocked drains can cause flooding and carry extra nutrients that harm water quality.

#### What Can You Do?

- Never dump anything into storm drains.
- Keep drains clear of leaves, trash, and yard debris.
- Remember: All of our gutters lead to storm drains and if you wouldn't swim in it, don't let it go down the drain.

### 4 WATER WISELY

#### The Issue:

- Overwatering lawns and gardens causes runoff that carries soil, fertilizer, and other pollutants into the lake.
- Excess water flowing down sidewalks wastes water and spreads contaminants.
- Poor shoreline landscaping can increase erosion and nutrient pollution.

#### What Can You Do?

- Adjust sprinklers so water stays on plants and soil, not pavement.
- Avoid overwatering and check for leaks regularly.
- Add native grasses or shrubs along shorelines to filter runoff and prevent erosion.

Protecting Canyon Lake starts at home. Each small step — reducing chemical use, cleaning up after pets, keeping storm drains clear, and managing water wisely — adds up when multiplied across the community. These actions are simple, cost little, and directly improve water quality. The healthier the lake is, the better it will be for fishing, swimming, and boating. By making everyday choices with the lake in mind, residents can play a vital role in keeping Canyon Lake beautiful and thriving for generations to come

# Roads Under Construction

## 2025 Pavement Improvements Underway!

The Canyon Lake POA has entered the third year of its multi-year pavement improvement program, reinforcing its commitment to enhancing and preserving the community's 37 miles of privately owned roads. This ongoing initiative reflects the Canyon Lake POA's dedication to providing safe, reliable, and well-maintained streets for all residents.

The first phase of the program began in 2022 with major repairs to the roads in the poorest condition, covering approximately 1.3 million square feet across 55 street segments. The second phase, approved in 2023, expanded the effort substantially, reconstructing additional miles and improving nearly 40 percent of the community's 8 million square feet of roads and parking areas. Together, these phases established a strong foundation for a long-term strategy centered on consistent annual investment in road maintenance and improvement.

At the July 1, 2025 Regular Session Board Meeting, the Board approved \$3,386,334.57 plus a 2.5% contingency from the Road Reserves Fund for this year's work. The current Road Reserve balance stands at \$6,692,140. Each year, the Board allocates additional funds to ensure ongoing maintenance of our largest asset — and liability — our roads.

# Upgraded Motorcycle Parking

## Refreshed Parking at the Senior Center

The Canyon Lake POA has completed improvements to the motorcycle parking area at the Senior Center. The project included seal coating, restriping, installation of new security fencing and cameras, and the addition of more designated motorcycle parking spaces. These upgrades enhance both the appearance and functionality of the facility, and the parking area has fully reopened for use.

These upgrades provide a more secure and well-maintained space for those who park their motorcycles within the community. Because motorcycles are not permitted to be stored or driven inside the community of Canyon Lake, designated motorcycle parking areas — such as those at the Senior Center, Eastport Park, and the North Gate — serve as convenient and essential locations for residents who own motorcycles. To make this even more convenient, residents who park their motorcycles here can view the live feed on our website at [www.clpoa.com/motorcycle-parking](http://www.clpoa.com/motorcycle-parking).

By improving the Senior Center parking area, the Canyon Lake POA is helping ensure that members who rely on these designated areas have safe, organized, and protected parking options. The addition of new fencing and resurfacing not only enhances the overall appearance but also provides better protection for motorcycles and personal enclosures.

This project also supports the Canyon Lake POA's long-range planning efforts to maintain safe, functional, and attractive facilities throughout the community. As part of the Board's five-year planning initiative, securing and improving motorcycle parking was identified as a key facility enhancement.

Never burn wrapping paper. The dyes and inks can be toxic and the lightweight paper can cause burning embers to escape.



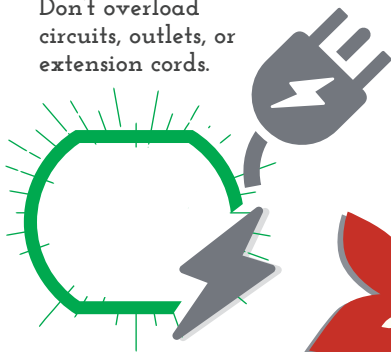

Don't overload circuits, outlets, or extension cords.



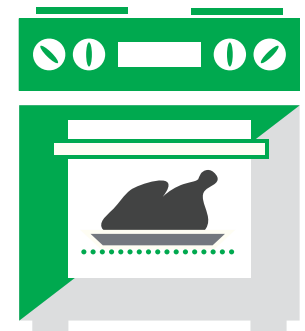

Poinsettias and mistletoe are poisonous. Keep away from children and pets.



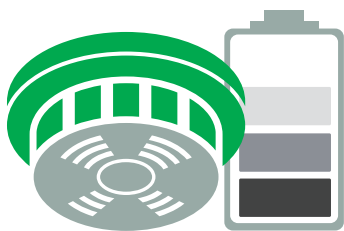
